Memorial monument to the murdered Jews of Mazheik, in front of the ruins of the old Jewish cemetery



Memorial monument to the murdered Jews of Mazheik. Recently a Menorah (Candelabra) and a Magen David (Star of David), made of pebbles, were added on the ground in front of the memorial.

Names of some of the victims, as well as the flags of Israel and Lithuania, were inscribed on some of the pebbles.

Note: it is presently unknown when and by whom these pebbles signs were added.

View of Vytauto street in Mazheik.
First to the left is Vytauto street no. 3, and the next house - Vytauto street no. 5 (see description below)



Wooden house in Vytauto street no. 3, where Zorach Peckel and his family lived until murdered in August 1941.

Zorach Peckel, a butcher, was brother of Ella Yariv's grandfather.



A contemporary house in Vytauto street no. 5, built on the ruins of a wooden house, where Eliyahu Faivel and Rashe Iting and their family lived until murdered in August 1941.

Eliyahu Faivel Iting, a shoemaker, was grandfather of Ilan Ganot.
